

Deeper (Nevermore) Copernicus Creeping, crawling, cajoling, careening and cavorting from the right side of the brain comes <u>Deeper</u>. With the exception of "Once, Once, Once Again" the majority of the lyrics and music on this, the third, Copernicus LP, were composed on the run, in bursts of full-blown, hot-blooded improvisation. Occasionally the results can be bloody irritating but, when Mr. C and his almighty (and, as you will hear, the exclamation marks are compulsory), the effect is nothing short of riveting. Take for instance, "Chichen-Itza Elvis", a romp through ancient capitals and civilizations with a Gaelic Bo Diddley in tow; on paper it would appear to be totally gung-ho -- on wax it is gloriously so, as Tony De Marco fiddles furiously over the grunts, grimaces and pontifi-cations of Copernicus' rich raucous voice. By contrast, "The Death Of Joe Apples" is, of its very nature, a moving funereal wake, punctuated with mournful trumpet wails. With its involved lyrical intuition and various combinations of 20 musicians releasing their demons, <u>Deeper</u> is, as its title suggests, an exploration into the cerebellum of a complex, creative and, at times, slightly cracked "performer".
